Summit County Public Health, Akron METRO Partner to Provide COVID-19 Vaccinations, Bus Passes to Residents

Pop-up shop provides travelers the chance to get vaccinated at METRO Transit Station

COLUMBUS – Summit County Public Health (SCPH) has partnered with Akron METRO to host pop-up vaccination clinics at the METRO Transit Station to better reach Summit County residents and talk to them about the benefits of COVID-19 vaccination.

"We know that there are people who are still hesitant to get vaccinated," said SCPH Health Commissioner Donna Skoda. "We want to connect with people and have personal conversations to let them know that this vaccine is safe, effective, and could save their lives. Sometimes a personal conversation is all that is needed to get someone to change their minds about being vaccinated. We want to thank METRO for their support and providing us this opportunity to connect with and vaccinate more residents."

The first pop-up clinic was held May 21, 2021 and led to the successful vaccination of 86 residents. There will be a second clinic June 18 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the same location. Both Johnson & Johnson and Pfizer vaccines are offered at the clinics. There are no appointments necessary. Those who receive the vaccine at the clinic will receive a seven-day bus pass via EZfare, METRO's mobile ticketing application.

If residents receive the Pfizer vaccine at the clinic, they can return to a later pop-up clinic at the METRO Transit Station to receive their second dose. They can also go to SCPH each Wednesday from 1 to 3:30 p.m. for their weekly vaccine clinic. The clinic is on a bus line, and they can ride for free if they are traveling to a vaccine appointment.
