

National Immunization Month



Hispanic American high risk adults are 20 percent less likely than non-Hispanic White adults to have ever received the pneumococcal vaccine.

- In 2020, Hispanic adults were 30 percent less likely to have received the influenza (flu) shot, as compared to Non-Hispanic Whites. African American adults are less likely than non-Hispanic White adults to have received a flu vaccine in the past year or to have ever received the pneumonia vaccine.
- In 2017, Non-Hispanic Blacks aged 65 and older were 10 percent less likely to have received the influenza (flu) shot in the past 12 months, as compared to non-Hispanic Whites of the same age group.

National Breast Feeding Month



Breastfeeding is associated with reduced risk for

various infections, necrotizing enterocolitis, sudden infant death syndrome, type 1 diabetes, and obesity among infants, and with reduced risk for high blood pressure, type 2 diabetes, ovarian cancer, and breast cancer among mothers, because Black and Al/AN populations are at increased risk for many of these health outcomes, lower rates of breastfeeding initiation among these groups are particularly concerning. It protects against allergies, sickness, and obesity. It protects against diseases, like diabetes and cancer. It protects against infections, like ear infections. It is easily digested – no constipation, diarrhea or upset stomach.


Children's Eye and Safety Month



Nearly 40% of preschool-aged children nationwide have never had a vision screening, During 2016 and 2017, only 63.5% of children 3 to 5 years old had their eyes tested by a doctor or other health professional, and Whites were more likely to

have been tested than African Americans and Hispanics, according to data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Children are susceptible to a host of vision and eye problems such as injury, infection and increased nearsightedness.
