

Cervical Health Awareness Month



The United States Congress designated January as Cervical Health Awareness Month. Cervical cancer is a disease in which cancer cells arise in the cervix. Human papillomavirus (HPV) is almost always the cause of cervical cancer, which is why vaccines against HPV are an important part of cervical cancer prevention strategies. Cervical cancer is one of many health outcomes that disproportionately affects biological females based on racial/ethnic background. The occurrence of cervical cancer is greater in Black/African American and Hispanic individuals compared to White individuals. Increasing screening and prevention are key components of the effort to eradicate

cervical cancer. Since almost all cases of the disease are caused by HPV infection, vaccines that protect against the virus could prevent the vast majority of cases. Regular Pap smear tests can catch and lead to treatment of the disease at the precancerous stage.

Glaucoma Awareness Month



January is National Glaucoma Awareness Month. Glaucoma is a group of eye diseases that randomly and gradually cause someone to lose their vision. Glaucoma is the second leading cause of vision loss and blindness in the United States. More than 3 million people in the United States have glaucoma. Glaucoma can affect people of all ages, although the most common forms primarily affect middle and older aged adults. Glaucoma has no early symptoms which is why half of people with glaucoma don't know they have it. Among Black/African American and Hispanic populations, glaucoma is more prevalent. Glaucoma is 6 to 8 times more common in Black people than White people. The only way to find out if you have glaucoma is to get a comprehensive dilated eye exam. There's no cure for glaucoma, but early treatment can often stop the damage and protect your vision.

National Birth Defects Prevention Month



National Birth Defects Prevention Month is a time to raise awareness about birth defects and highlight efforts to improve the health of people living with these conditions. Birth defects are physical or biochemical changes that are present at birth. They can cause problems with how the body develops or how the body works. Some racial and ethnic groups are affected more by certain types of birth defects and are more likely to die from causes related to birth defects. For example, there is a 34% higher chance for babies of non-Hispanic Black mothers to develop birth defects

than babies of non-Hispanic White mothers, and a 26% higher chance for babies of Hispanic mothers than for babies of White mothers. We don't know exactly what causes most birth defects, but, you can increase your chances of having a healthy baby by doing what you can to be your healthiest self both before and during pregnancy.

Things you can do include:

- Get early and regular prenatal care.
- · Learn about your genes and your family health history.
- Get to and maintain a healthy weight.
- Don't smoke, drink alcohol or use drugs.
- Avoid secondhand smoke during pregnancy.
- Don't eat fish that contain large amounts of mercury during pregnancy.


