The annual fee assessed shall be based on the facility status of the previous calendar year, as of December 31. Annual fees shall be invoiced and paid annually. All fees are due within 30 days of receipt of invoice. A ten percent (10%) late charge will be assessed on all delinquent payments. Allowable emissions for the facility is defined as the summation of the total allowable emissions for each regulated pollutant emitted at a rate in excess of 1 ton per year, including fugitive emissions.</p>
