
From 2007 to 2011, an average of nearly oneand-a-half Summit County residents died of a drug overdose per week. Since then, the rate has risen to nearly 4 per week.

Overdoses now account for a higher percent of non-natural deaths (35%) than falls and suicide combined.




**GROWTH IN THE** NUMBER OF DRUG **OVERDOSE DEATHS** PER WEEK SINCE 2007-2011





- Sex More than two-thirds of overdose victims are male.
- Race White overdose victims make up 81% of all overdose victims. Black overdoses rose from 13% of the total to 21% in the past 5 years.
- Marital Status- More than eight-in-ten overdose victims were either never married (57%) or divorced (25%).
